They can seek employment.

In Bayside

If they stay in Bayside ...

... they can study 2, 3 or 4 A-levels.

What they can do will depend on their results!

A-level courses

Students must study at

least two subjects at A level.

Two or three A-level courses?

Three A-Level courses is the typical 'diet' most A-Level students follow.

Some students, however, may cope better if they follow *two* A-Level courses.

Two or three A-level courses?

To follow **two** A-Level courses ...

... they must have achieved a minimum of four GCSE grade 4 or C passes (or higher).

(preferably including English and mathematics)

Two or three A-level courses?

To follow three A-Level courses ...

... they must have achieved a **minimum** of **five** GCSE grade 4 or C passes (or higher).

(preferably including English and mathematics)

Four A-level courses ...

To follow **four** A-Level courses ...

... they must have achieved a minimum of six GCSE grade 6 or B passes (or higher). (MUST include English and mathematics)

(in our experience, only students with **exceptional** GCSE grades can cope with this) (8s and 9s)

This is subject to change as some courses that are currently alternated might be offered at more than one institution, depending on numbers.

Parent institution

When they make their choices, they will 'belong' to the institution where they are following the majority of their courses.

Entry requirements

Different subjects have different entry requirements.

These need to be carefully checked in the *Post-GCSE Options Booklet*.

Entry requirements

They should also check the entry requirements for *post-18 courses*, since this will affect their choices.

Expectations

They will have to sign a sixth form Code of Conduct.

Code of conduct

This includes:

- Being role models for other students
 - wearing the school uniform
 - > setting a behavioural example
- Studying independently

Other possibilities

Some students might have given of their best, but may not achieve four grade 4/C's or above.

These students may benefit from trying to obtain further GCSEs.

Other possibilities

Bayside no longer offers a repeat course in Year 12, so students who would like to obtain further GCSEs will need to enrol in the <u>Gibraltar College</u>.
