In Bayside

If you stay in Bayside ...

... you can study 2, 3 or 4 A-levels.

What you can do will depend on your results!

A-level courses

Students must study at

least two subjects at A-level.

Two or three A-level courses?

Three A-Level courses is the typical 'diet' most A-Level students follow.

Some students, however, may cope better if they follow *two* A-Level courses.

Two or three A-level courses?

To follow **two** A-Level courses ...

... you must have achieved a *minimum* of *four* GCSE grade 4 or C passes (or higher).

(preferably including English and mathematics)

Two or three A-level courses?

To follow *three* A-Level courses ...

... you must have achieved a *minimum* of *five* GCSE grade 4 or C passes (or higher).

(preferably including English and mathematics)

Four A-level courses ...

To follow **four** A-Level courses ...

... you must have achieved a *minimum* of *six* GCSE grade 6 or B passes (or higher). (MUST include English and mathematics)

(in our experience, only students with **exceptional** GCSE grades can cope with this) (8s and 9s)


