## *English literature ...

... is not a separate option, it is studied within GCSE English lessons.

As many students as possible will do language and literature, but this will depend on ability and potential.

## What courses do they follow?

Compulsory: English, mathematics, combined science, Spanish, core PE, RE, and PSHE

## GCSE courses

These are the 'traditional' courses which have always been offered in schools.

They are assessed through examinations in Year 11 and some have NEAs too.

## Vocational subjects

Certificate of Personal Effectiveness (CoPE)
Child Development
Digital Technologies
Design and Craft: Fashion Wear
Construction
Hair and Beauty
Sports Studies

## Vocational subjects

These subjects are vocational alternatives to the traditional GCSE courses ...
... but, with the exception of CoPE and Construction, they are NOT aimed at lessacademic students.

## Vocational subjects

They are all very academic in nature and are NOT apprenticeships.

They have a great deal of theory and end-of-course exams in Year 11.

## Vocational subjects

## They are not graded like GCSEs. grat $x^{-1}$

## They are offered at Level 1 and Level 2.

Construction is ONLY offered at Level 1

## Level 1 and 2 equivalence

The range of achievement at Level 1 is equivalent to Grades 1-3 at GCSE

The range of achievement at Level 2 is equivalent to Grades 4-9 at GCSE

For CoPE - Level 1 is equivalent to Grade 2/3 at GCSE

- Level 2 is equivalent to Grade 5/6 at GCSE
