These subjects are *vocational* alternatives to the traditional GCSE courses ...

... but, with the exception of CoPE and Construction, they are **NOT** aimed at less-academic students.

They are all *very academic* in nature and are *NOT* apprenticeships.

They have a *great deal* of theory and end-of-course exams in Year 11.

They are not graded like GCSEs.



They are offered at Level 1 and Level 2.

Construction is **ONLY** offered at Level 1

Level 1 and 2 equivalence

The range of achievement at Level 1 is equivalent to Grades 1-3 at GCSE

The range of achievement at Level 2 is equivalent to Grades 4-9 at GCSE

For CoPE - Level 1 is equivalent to Grade 2/3 at GCSE

- Level 2 is **equivalent** to Grade 5/6 at GCSE

Option subjects

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Alternatives

We will provide alternative routes in **some** subjects for those students who may struggle with a full GCSE/vocational package.

This will be discussed on an individual basis when they have indicated the subject areas they are interested in.
